Catholic Teaching and the 'Scandal of Capital Punishment': A Real Life Example In regards to the death penalty, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "if...non-lethal means are sufficient to defend and protect people's safety from the aggressor, authority will limit itself to such means, as these are more in keeping with the concrete conditions of the common good and more in conformity with the dignity of the human person" (no. 2267). Likewise, our U.S. Catholic Bishops have identified "compelling reasons for opposing capital punishment—its sheer inhumanity and its absolute finality, as well as concern about its inequitable use and an imperfect legal system that has sentenced innocent people to death" (Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities). On Sun, Oct 29, Noon-1:30pm all are invited to St. Joan of Arc Parish (4940 Tuscarawas W., Canton) for a presentation on how Catholic teaching applies to the death penalty, looking at the example of a man who spent 30 years on death row.
