Bishop Murry, S.J. will celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation for adults** on Sun, Nov 18 at 2pm in St. Columba Cathedral. This is a special opportunity for parishioners age 18 or older who have not received the sacrament to join with other adults of the diocese. Confirmation candidates must register with our parish and participate in Confirmation preparation. Candidates must be prepared and eligible to receive the sacrament by verifying baptism and marital status, Confirmation preparation and eligibility of sponsors. Sponsors must be confirmed, practicing Catholics and may not be the candidate's parent. Contact the parish office by Oct 15 to register and verify eligibility.

News from the St. Vincent de Paul Society: During the month of Sept, in honor of St. Vincent de Paul's feast day, we will be collecting items to fill male and female hygiene bags. On average, more than twenty of these bags are distributed to people in need each month at our Ashtabula County Catholic Charities office.
